Note that for any turnaround that is quicker than what is listed, a \$50.00 rush fee may be added, depending on the length of your manuscript and the time it takes to read.

LEVEL OF EDITS

- In-line comments in document, using track changes in Microsoft Word
- Suggestions will be made on ways to improve story, particularly in the following areas:
 - Character arc
 - Romance arc
 - Pacing of story
 - Effectiveness of external conflict
 - Effectiveness of internal conflict
 - Dialogue effectiveness
 - Continuity of story
 - Emotional impact of story
 - Depth of writing/POV
 - World building
 - Main characters
 - Secondary characters
 - Antagonists
 - Story logic
- An editorial letter will be included which summarizes the overarching issues and strengths of the book.

WHEN SHOULD THIS BE DONE?

- When you have completed the first draft of your manuscript and you need input on the various elements of your book.
- This this type of edit will often require big structural changes to your book, so it is done before line editing.
- This is an in-depth edit that will require at least **two and a half weeks** in turnaround time for manuscripts up to 60,000; **three weeks** in turnaround time for manuscripts up to 100,000.

LINE EDITING - \$0.006/WORD

LEVEL OF EDITS

- In-line comments in document, using track changes in Word
- Suggestions will be made on ways to improve the prose, particularly in the following areas:
 - Continuity
 - Structure of sentences
 - Repetition of words
 - Depth of POV
 - Showing versus telling
 - o Tense issues
 - Sequence
 - Improving clarity of sentences

WHEN SHOULD THIS BE DONE?

- This is after you have finished developmental edits or beta reading, and you are looking to polish your manuscript.
- Ideally, this is not when you should introduce major changes into your book.
- This is an in-depth edit that will require at least **two and a half weeks** in turnaround time for manuscripts up to 60,000; **three weeks** in turnaround time for manuscripts up to 100,000.
- A copy editor should still be used after line edits to ensure that no errors are made in entering line edits/making changes.

BETA READING - \$0.004/WORD

LEVEL OF EDITS

- In-line comments in document, using track changes in Microsoft Word
- Suggestions will be made on ways to improve the story, particularly in the following areas:
 - Story logic that all parts of the story follow a cohesive structure
 - Relatability of characters
 - Inconsistences in plot or actions



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- Pace of story
- Romance arc
- Character arc
- Story goals accomplished
- Strength of conflicts
- Story structure
- No editorial letter will be provided.
- No line editing or copy editing is done.
- This is an overarching look at your book, as a critique partner would do, looking at how your book will work with readers.

WHEN SHOULD THIS BE DONE?

- When you feel that your story is strong in structure and major arcs/characterization, and you just want an extra eye on the book. This is a good time to check for inconsistencies in your plot or in your story logic.
- When you have already done substantial self-editing on the book, and your manuscript is in its second or third draft.
- This is less of an in-depth edit than line editing or developmental editing, and thus requires a turnaround time of **two weeks** for manuscripts up to 60,000 and **two and a half weeks** for manuscripts up to 100,000.

COPY EDITING - \$0.005/WORD

LEVEL OF EDITS

- In-line comments, using Microsoft Word track changes
- This is a deeper edit than proofreading (see below)
- Copy editing checks for:
 - Typos



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- Words used incorrectly
- Grammar and punctuation
- Cadence of words i.e., if something is grammatically incorrect, copy editor will suggest a different word/structure that keeps the rhythm of your prose
- Etymology (only in historicals this is to make sure that you are not using words that will flag as modern to the reader)
- Consistency in the story this is a light check on consistency, for obvious glaring errors in things that contradict
- Repetition in prose
- No comments will be given on the story itself.

WHEN SHOULD THIS BE DONE?

- When all story structure/developmental issues have been fixed in your manuscript
- This is a more in depth edit than proofreading, so should be done before proofreading
- This requires a turnaround time of **one week and a half** for manuscripts up to 60,000; and **two weeks** for manuscripts up to 100,000.

PROOFREADING - \$0.003/WORD

LEVEL OF EDITS

- In-line comments, using Microsoft Word track changes
- This is a basic edit making sure that all of your copy edits were entered correctly and that there are no longer mistakes in your manuscript.
- Proofreading checks for:
 - Typos
 - Words used incorrectly
 - Grammar and punctuation
- No comments will be given on the story itself.

WHEN SHOULD THIS BE DONE?

- When your manuscript has already gone through copy edits, and all story structure/developmental issues have been fixed.
- This is a final check on your manuscript.

• This requires a **one-week turnaround time** for manuscripts up to 60,000; and **one and a half weeks** for manuscripts up to 100,000.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

BLURB WRITING

- New Blurb Writing \$45.00
 - Erica will write a blurb based on the details you provide about the book. This is for a blurb from scratch, with no prior drafts written.
- Revised Blurb Writing \$20.00
 - Erica will revise your existing blurb to really make your prose shine. Focus will be on keywords, tropes, and getting at the crux of the book.
- Erica requires a three-day turnaround on blurbs
